#### Used in a sentence:

#### **Etymology** and historical meaning of the term courteous:

Middle English (meaning 'having manners fit for a royal court'): from Old French *corteis*, based on Latin *cohors* 'yard, retinue'. The change in the ending in the 16th cent. was due to association with words ending in *-eous*.
