

Definitions:

1: to arrange for people to come together for a formal meeting.

convene

Used in a sentence:

- **A board of enquiry was convened immediately after the exams.**
- **The student council will convene at 11.30 in the library.**

Etymology and historical meaning of the term **convene**:

late Middle English: from Latin *convenire* 'assemble, agree, fit', from *con-* 'together' + *venire* 'come'.

Verb: to convene
