co-operate

Used in a sentence:

- •The two groups agreed to cooperate with each other.
- •They had cooperated closely in the planning of the project.
- •The teacher asked the students for their full cooperation.

Etymology and historical meaning of the term co-operate:

Originated 1595–1605 from Late Latin *cooperatus* ("work with").
