Used in a sentence:

- *Be humble enough to learn from your mistakes.*
- *my humble tribute to this great man*
- *a humble farmhouse*
- *The company has worked its way up from humble beginnings to become the market leader.*
- *Most of us have never considered the humble potato as a precious gift from nature.*

Etymology and historical meaning of the term **celebrate success:**

Middle English: from Old French, from Latin *humilis* 'low, lowly', from *humus* 'ground'.

Different verb forms:

- *humble (verb) · humbles (third person present)*
- *humbléd (past tense) · humbled (past participle)*
- *humbling (present participle)*
