

Definitions:

- 1: to introduce a new public official or leader at a special ceremony
- 2: to officially open a building or start an organization with a special ceremony

Inaugurate

Used in a sentence:

- 1: *Sir Kier Starmer has been inaugurated (as) the new Prime Minister following his success at the July 2024 General Election .*
- 2: *The new English and Maths block was inaugurated in 2019.*
- 3: *Students will be inaugurated into their new year groups in September*

Etymology and historical meaning of the term **inaugurate**:

late 16th cent.: from Latin *inaugurat-* 'interpreted as omens (from the flight of birds)', based on *augurare* 'to augur'.
