Used in a sentence:

She took a benevolent interest in her son's education.
They were considered to be a benevolent school because they contributed to the local food bank every year.

<u>Etymology</u> and historical meaning of the term benevolent:

From late Middle English: originallly from the Old French *benivolent*, from Latin *bene volent-* 'well wishing', from *bene* 'well' + *velle* 'to wish'.
