<u>Etymology</u> and historical meaning of the term omniscient

From the early 17th century, originating from the medieval Latin *omniscient-which means* 'all-knowing', based on *scire* 'to know'.

Used in a sentence:

- 1: The novel has an omniscient narrator.
- 2: The film used the camera to present an omniscient perspective.
- 3: The omniscient student know all the answers!
