

Definitions :

- 1: (of a problem, mystery, etc.) that cannot be solved or explained
- 2: **nsoluble (in something)** (of a substance) that does not [dissolve](#) in a liquid

insoluble

Used in a sentence:

1: *the mathematics problem seemed insoluble.*

2: *These chemicals are practically insoluble in water.*

Etymology and historical meaning of the term **insoluble**.

From the late Middle English: from Old French, or from Latin *insolubilis*, from *in-* 'not' + *solubilis*, from *solvere* 'loosen, unfasten'.

Collocations: to be insoluble, to seem insoluble, to remain insoluble, almost insoluble, apparently insoluble, seemingly insoluble
