Definitions :

- 1: (of a problem, mystery, etc.) that cannot be solved or explained
- 2: nsoluble (in something) (of a substance) that does not dissolve in a liquid

insoluble	<u>Etymology</u> and historical meaning of the term insoluble. From the late Middle English: from Old French, or from Latin <i>insolubilis</i> , from <i>in-</i> 'not' + <i>solubilis</i> , from <i>solvere</i> 'loosen, unfasten'.
Used in a sentence: 1: the mathematics problem seemed insoluble.	Collocations: to be insoluble, to seem insoluble, to remain insoluble, almost insoluble, apparently insoluble, seemingly insoluble
2: These chemicals are practically insoluble in water.	 Questions: How does this link with the theme of the week: Being Resilient? Can you think of any synonyms for the word insoluble? Could you use words of the same family (verbs, nouns) in sentences?
