Definitions:

- 1: something that decides or limits the way in which something can be done (all subjects)
- 2: a quantity whose value is selected for the particular circumstances and in relation to which other variable quantities may be expressed. (Mathematics/statistics)
- 3: a limit or boundary which defines the scope of a particular process or activity (all subjects).

parameter

Used in a sentence:

- 1: We had to work within the parameters that had been established by the school council.
- 2: The three school rules of 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' set the parameters for expected behaviours in class and around the school for every student.
- 3: The students were given strict parameters for their research project on the internet.

Etymology and historical meaning of the term parameter.

From the mid 17th century to modern Latin and Greek *para-* 'beside' + *metron* 'measure'.
