vulnerability	<u>Etymology</u> and historical meaning of the word <mark>vulnerability.</mark> From 1600 – late Latin meaning "capable of being wounded- " <i>vulnerabilis</i> "wounding," from Latin <i>vulnerare</i> "to wound, hurt, injure, maim".
Used in a sentence: 1: The elderly are more vulnerable to flu and cold viruses in the winter months.	Synonyms for vulnerability: exposure. risk, openness, susceptibility, liability, predisposition, helplessness, danger.
